ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Students must have a score of at least 20 on the ACT English test or a score of at least 450 on the SAT Writing test in order to be admitted as freshmen into the English major. In order to be admitted into the Creative Writing track, students must, by the beginning of their sophomore year at the college, submit to the writing faculty a portfolio of their creative work for evaluation. Students will be either granted or denied admission to the track based on faculty evaluation of this portfolio. Students who are denied admission as sophomores may submit another portfolio for evaluation at the beginning of the junior year. If admission is again denied, the student may not apply again.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: Four semesters of one modern foreign language are required.

HUMANITIES CORE: As outlined on the Humanities Core Check Sheet.

Among **REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION**, the student must have a 2.00 average in the major.

HUMANITIES CORE

All students in a Humanities major are required to complete 12 hours in the Humanities Core: 6-8 hours from block I, 2-4 hours from block II, and 2-4 hours from block III. At least 6 credits must come from block I, at least 2 from block II, and at least 2 from block III. Any course used to fulfill a requirement in the Liberal Studies program may NOT be used to fulfill a requirement in the Humanities core. Other than those courses used to fulfill a Liberal Studies program requirement, however, students may use courses required in their majors or minors to fulfill Humanities Core requirements as well.
